Just over one year ago I began serving as your Interim Parish Administrator. I've been a member of Risen Savior Parish for over 30 years but little did I know how vibrant this community is until I worked here. Staff and volunteers at Risen Savior are amazing. Staff plan dynamic, faith filled liturgies; programs; learning opportunities; and fun social events that they and volunteers execute. DEPARTMENTAL HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED

COMMUNICATION

- To broaden parishioner range and to reach a wider audience, the focus on electronic communication in all departments was expanded: RS Media, Friday email, electronic newsletters, electronic bulletin, Flocknote, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, electronic sign on Co. Rd. 42.
- The process of developing a new, dynamic Risen Savior website is nearing completion.

Safe Environment: Protecting God's Children (VIRTUS)

• The VIRTUS program has completely switched from in-person to online credentialing of employees and volunteers, which is a huge improvement and expedites the credentialing process exponentially. The program is offered in English and in Spanish.

COMMUNITY LIFE

- Friday, September 16, 2022, from 6:00-11:00 p.m.: Annual Risen Savior Fall Fest. Approximately 400+ parishioners attended.
- Weekend October 8/9, 2022: Introduced Tim Keegan, interim Parish Administrator, to the parish. Refreshments were served after each Mass. Parishioners took advantage of the opportunity to welcome,
- Friday, February 17, 2023, from 7:00-10:00 p.m.: Mardi Gras Hoedown, Beads & Bandanas event featuring country music, line dancing lessons, Mardi Gras decorations, and King Cake. Approximately 160 guests attended.
- Risen Savior is part of and hosts the SALT (Seniors Learning Together, Inc.) program. SALT is an interfaith coalition of area churches providing enrichment learning to people over age 55. Sessions are held in spring and fall at Risen Savior. Attendance Fall 2022: 510, Spring 2023: 817.
- Weekend June 24/25, 2023; farewell receptions after all Masses for Fr. Tim Rudolphi.
- The Women's Holiday Pause event was held at the Holiday Inn in Lakeville on November 4, 2022. 112 women attended the beautiful event.
- Restructured Risen Savior's responses to online parish registrations by establishing a process of immediate and direct contact with the new members as well as periodically touching base.

LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION

General/All Ages

Our Advent Birthday Bags service project was a big success, providing 360 Communities with birthday gifts for children in need throughout 2023. We packed 284 birthday bags.

Elementary Formation

- 11 students participated in the Preschool and Kindergarten program.
- 57 students (grades 1-4) and their parents participated in the G.I.F.T. (Growing In Faith Together)
- 34 children (grades 2-9)) celebrated First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our English program.
- 78 children (grades 2-12) celebrated First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our Spanish program.
- 17 children participated in Vacation Bible School in June 2023.

Secondary Formation (Middle & High School)

- 50 students in grades 5-8 enrolled in Middle School Faith Formation in English.
- 15 students enrolled in Confirmation 1 (grades 9-11) in the English program and 33 students enrolled in
- 16 students from our English program and 37 from our Spanish program participated in the Confirmation 2 program and celebrated the Sacrament at the Cathedral in St. Paul with Archbishop Hebda presiding.

- 3 of our middle school youth and Rae Ann Konkol attended Catholic Youth Summer Camp sponsored by Damascus Ministries. This camp is open to students in grades 5-8.
- Sanctuary, our high school youth group, continues to grow. We average 25-30 youth each week.
- 21 youth and 7 adults went on Mission Trip to Savannah, GA, to serve the community there.

Adult Formation

- July 2022-June 2023: We baptized 32 children in the Anglo community.
- 2 adults participated in the English RCIA process, both of whom received Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. • 5 children participated in the English CIC process. 1 of these children was baptized and received First Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. 4 of these children received First Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.
- The Women's Coffee Fellowship group met once a month from October-May. They had between 15-50 participants each month.
- The Catholic Watchmen continued meeting monthly with about 10-12 men attending.
- The MOMS Group continued meeting once a month and had about 7 active members.
- Art Zannoni led our annual Advent Evening of Reflection for about 50 participants.
- In January, Risen Savior and Pax Christi (Eden Prairie) hosted in person and virtual talks on Archbishop Hebda's Pastoral Letter "You will be my witnesses." 30 Risen Savior parishioners participated.
- · During Lent, we focused on the Pillars of Lent: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.
 - Mike Rios-Keating from Twin Cities Catholic Charities presented "Rend Your Heart: Offering Humility during Lent" for about 20 participants.
 - We hosted a 4-week series "Meaningful Conversations about Prayer" for about 15 participants.
 - We started parish Lenten Service Opportunities: 47 parishioners volunteered at the Lenten Spring Clean of our parish building, 8 parishioners filled our volunteer day with Burnsville Loaves and Fishes at Faith Covenant Church, 45 parishioners volunteered over 2 days at Feed My Starving Children and packed 59,184 meals for children across the globe.
- Adult Faith Formation & Pastoral Ministry co-facilitated the Summer Read "Gift of Years" for 35 participants. In April, 22 participants held a potluck and watch party for the author, Sr. Joan Chittister's, presentation on this book

SOCIAL JUSTICE

- Habitat for Humanity: during this fiscal year, we have held two 3-day builds. In August 2022 we raised \$5,368 for Habitat and had 13-15 construction volunteers on site each day. We moved our partnership up to June in 2023 and raised \$5,000 for Habitat and had 10-12 construction volunteers on site each day of the build. In addition, we recruited new volunteer roles over the past 2 builds: prayer team members and on-site photographers, which have been fun new ways to participate!
- There were 2 small groups of 20 participants total in the JustFaith "Faith and Racial Equity" program in

- 175 people participated in the annual Bread for the World Advocacy Campaign "Offering of Letters."
- The Social Justice and Outreach commission held a winter gear drive in November. We donated items to the Dakota Woodlands Family Shelter, Dakota County Social Services, Ally Supportive Services, and unsheltered folks in encampments in Minneapolis.
- 23 parishioners attended the Social Justice Retreat "Prophets of a Future not our own" in October 2022.
- Our parish's Environmental Concerns committee worked on many projects including: Fr. Denny Dempsey Bike Rack Memorial; Lenten Book Group on "Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World," which had 39 participants from Risen Savior and neighboring communities; they partnered with GotSneakers to collect old sneakers for recycling and collected 339 pairs.
- From July 2022-June 2023, our parish donated 12,762 pounds of food to 360 Communities Food Shelf via our Food on the First program.
- The Human Trafficking committee has continued educating our parish through bulletin articles about the myths and realities of trafficking. They have also organized gratitude baskets for local law enforcement and community outreach workers who serve victims and survivors of trafficking.
- 12 Meals on Wheels volunteers bring meals to neighbors in the community every Tuesday afternoon.
- Volunteers continue to cook and serve free, curbside meals through Loaves and Fishes.
- · 6 volunteers serve brunch once/month for residents at the Dakota Woodlands family shelter in Eagan
- The Human Trafficking committee raised approx. \$3600 with the jewelry sale for Brittany's Place and Breaking Free. Their Lenten Stations of the Cross to end human trafficking had 5-20 participants each week. Their annual donation drive yielded \$150 worth of gift cards and 20 boxes of requested supplies each to *Breaking Free* and *Brittany's Place*. The committee raised \$1250 for future projects. They sponsored a presentation "Building Safer, Stronger Families" for grade 5 Faith Formation parents and
- Risen Savior Prison Ministry: 9 volunteers contribute to the Ignatian Meditation videos; we sponsored Christmas gifts for 21 children of incarcerated parents. The birthday card ministry has 15 volunteers who write to 25 people a month.
- The Respect Life Committee held their annual Baby Bottle Campaign raising about \$5600 for Pregnancy Choices, Mother's Day Flower Sale, raising \$1470, and Donuts for Dads events
- The Sister Parish Committee continues to be in communication with our Sister Parish, St. Rose of Lima (Gris Gris, Haiti), and our parish as a whole has offered communal prayers during Mass for them. St. Rose continues to pray weekly for our parish. This fiscal year, Risen Savior raised about \$46,000 in support of our Sister Parish.
- The Social Justice Awareness Book Group has about 12 members and continues learning about antiracism efforts and diverse cultures
- On May 3, 9 parishioners participated in the virtual Ignatian Justice Summit for parishes.

PASTORAL CARE

- There have been 35 funerals since July 2022. 4 funeral luncheon teams served 28 luncheons.
- Grief Ministry follow-up calls and mailings continued on a monthly basis.
- Risen Savior continues to be a member of the Growing Through Loss Coalition. Our Fall series was held at St. John Neumann and was very well attended.
- The Widow's Connection meets monthly with approximately 25 women attending.
- We have 9 active BeFriender Ministers. They meet monthly from September-June. They hosted the annual All Souls Remembrance Service in November.
- 14 Word/Communion presiders minister monthly at Villa Assisted Living, Augustana Care Center, Havenwood Senior Living, Ecumen Senior Living. Monthly Masses at the Villa, Havenwood, and Ecumen.
- 4 Communion Ministers bring Communion to the patients at Ridges Hospital once a week • 7 home Eucharistic MInisters are assigned to take Communion to people unable to come to Church.
- Many of our BeFrienders also bring Communion to their BeFriendees. We regularly receive online prayer requests. Our prayer ministers are very faithful to this ministry. · Our Prayer Shawl creators and Peacemakers continue to create beautiful shawls and quilts for
- people experiencing a surgery, a loss, or a joy in their lives. They also provide shawls and quilts to the Spiritual Care Department at Ridges Hospital. The Human Trafficking Committee gives prayer shawls to graduates of the Breaking Free program. • 32 Cub Foods cards and 34 gas cards were given to people who came to our office in need of
- assistance. Risen Savior also donated \$125 in gas cards to 360 Communities.
 Risen Savior contributes \$700/monthly to 360 Communities for their emergency fund and contributes \$150/monthly to Community Cares, who sources food for our Minneapolis Loaves and Fishes team. Each
- month a team of 4-6 volunteers serve 180-300 free meals at the Holy Rosary Loaves and Fishes site. In April 2023, Risen Savior increased the monthly donation to 360 Communities from \$700 to \$1400/ month and has been contributing \$150/monthly to Burnsville Loaves and Fishes.

LATINO MINISTRY

- · Parochial Vicar, Father Mario Castagnola, has been tending to the needs of the Latino Ministry by covering all Masses. Sacraments. Adult Formation. Holy Hour with the Blessed Sacrament, celebration of wedding Masses, funerals, and Quinceañeras, visiting homes to bless, and advising the Latino Commission and the Guadalupe Committee.
- On average, approximately 800 people attend Sunday Masses.
- Sacraments: 45 baptisms, 11 weddings,
- 3 funerals and 5 memorial services
- 16 Quinceañera Masses were celebrated.
- R.C.I.A.: 11 adults were prepared in the RCIA program to receive the sacraments of Communion and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil.
- The annual Health Fair was held in October 2022, 175 flu vaccines and 45 COVID vaccines were given. They also tested blood pressure, diabetes, and applied fluoride to the teeth of children and adults. · On three Sundays, lawyers and qualified professionals from the Archdiocesan Civil Rights Assembly
- provided information and support to the Latino community with their immigration processes and licenses. • 46 days before December 12, the Guadalupe Committee visited 46 homes with the Pilgrim Virgin; the
- Rosary was prayed, the word of God was shared. • December 12, the celebration of the festival to the Virgin of Guadalupe was successful with more than 1000 people in attendance. There were approximately 50 volunteers, including the Guadalupe Committee
- On June 17, 2023, the Guadalupe Committee in collaboration with the Latino Commission organized a pilgrimage to the Sanctuary of the Virgin of Guadalupe in LaCrosse, WI. It was a very significant spiritual adventure and integrated Anglo and Latino cultures.
